1A

12pm - 1pm: Most Commonly Prescribed Oral Medication - An Update Brian Hall, OD ■ 1 NJSBO Oral Credit - COPE # PENDING

This course reviews the oral medications most commonly used in general medicine. These medications may have clinically significant adverse ocular effects front their oral application or clinical applications for the management of ocular disease. Potential drug interaction issues arising from treatment of ocular disease are emphasized in the lecture.

1pm - 3pm: Oral Medication Grand Rounds

This course provides an overview and insight into a number of ocular conditions with a focus on oral medications and their use in the management of these diseases. A grand rounds approach with rapid fire case presentations will be utilized to stimulate discussion of various treatment options, Clinical indication, potential adverse side effects, treatment alternatives and appropriate follow up will be discussed for each case.

3pm - 5pm: Neuro-Ophthalmic Manifestations of Systemic Disease Brian Hall, OD ■ 2 NJSBO Oral Credits - COPE # 52173-OP

A series of grand round cases are used to discuss the relationship between systemic and ocular disease, as well as, the systemic medications used to treat them. Appropriate diagnosis work up based on ocular finding sare reviewed. The ocular side effects of various medications used in the treatment of systemic disease and the recommendations for monitoring the adverse effects are covered.

This course presents an overview for the primary eye care provider on the benefits of various oral nutritional supplements. Specific benefits, dosage of the oral supplements, as well as, current research of nutrition and the eye will be discussed.

10:20am - 12:00pm: Macular Carotenoids and Cognitive and Visual Functions Across the Lifespan Lisa Renzi, OD • 1 Oral/1 Regular NJSBO Credits PENDING - COPE # 49746-GO

In this course, you will learn how dietary behaviors impact overall ocular and neurological health. Specifically, you will discover the ways in which dietary behaviors, such as communing carotenoid-rich foods and supplements, can reduce risk for ocular disease and improve visual function across the lifespan. Given the fact that the retina is the nest model tissue that exits for understanding the brain, you will also explore how dietary carotenoids also influence cognition and brain health.

You will review the most commonly available ocular medication in the pediatric population. Diagnostic, antibiotic, and allergy agents and more will be presented with the age availability, proper dosages and side effects of each discussed. You will learn examination procedures and normative data specific to pediatric pathology diagnosis in infants and toddlers. Presentations of the anterior and posterior segment pathology frequently diagnosed in the pediatric population and the proper treatment for each will be presented.

10:20am - 11:10am: iStrain: What Effects Do Today's Tablets and Media Social Devices Have on Vision? Valerie Kattouf, OD • 1 NJSBO Regular Credit - COPE # 45941-FV

Today's world presents a variety of challenges in regard to vision usage. You will learn the effect of today's expotential use of media and its effect on children in regard to vision and academics. Common visual symptoms and the diagnosis and treatment of the accommodative and binocular vision issues that cause them will be reviewed. The information shared will aim at allowing practitioners to give the proper treatment to patients and the proper advice to parents who ask about the effect of the digital age on our vision.

A review of the pathophysiology of concussion and the incidence and effect in today's population will be reviewed, as well as, the visual findings in concussion patients. The necessary optometric testing to diagnose the binocular vision, accommodative and ocular motor findings in concussion patients is presented to the practitioner in an organized and practical fashion. Protocol for the optometric practitioner to guide the concussion patient to return to play and return to learn will be reviewed.

2pm - 2:50pm: Pediatric Examination Clinical Pearls

This lecture will review infant examination techniques and clinical presentations as well as deviations from normal in the infant population. The expected findings in the areas of developmental milestones and ocular systems will be presented. Methods of visual acuity determination, detection of strabismus and amblyopia, and common refractive errors will be discussed. The goals of this course include increasing the practitioners comfort level when dealing with infants and stressing the importance of early intervention. The use of practical case examples and illustrative photographs aid the participants learning.
